

Informative Advance N°126

Regarding the request by the JEP to "provide information on the search for missing persons in municipalities adjacent to the Ituango Hydroelectric Project", EPM informs the public opinion:

1. On March 4, 2019, EPM received a request for information from the First Instance Section in cases where the JEP did not recognize the truth and lacked responsibility, related to the recovery, care, protection and preservation of 16 places in Colombia, including some located in the Ituango Hydroelectric Project's area of influence, without specifying their specific location. The company is processing this request.

2. It is important to remember that, within the framework of due diligence and respect for human rights, in 2013, EPM requested the Attorney General's Office, as the entity in charge of the search, to identify and surrender missing persons and expedite the pending processes reported to the investigative body in the area where the dam and reservoir area would be built.

3. To facilitate the investigative body's work, EPM has provided support through its social aid liaison for Ituango Hydroelectric Project, SOCYA. All through collaboration with the different authorities, without any agreement or contract having been signed with the National Attorney General to that end.
